Examinations and Grading: There will be homework assignments, two mid semester exams, and a final. Each midterm exam has a weight of 25% and the final has a weight of 35% in the determination of the course grade. Homework assignments will have a weight of 15% of your grade.

The tests will be graded on a 100 point basis, on the scale where 94 or above is an A+, 86-93 is an A, 81-85 is a B+, 76-80 is a B, 71-75 is a C+, 66-70 is a C, 56-65 is a D and 55 or below is an F.

Students who miss a midterm exam, and have a legitimate excuse (provide full documentation) will have the weight of their final adjusted accordingly.
